Subject: Online Lecture Series on Standard Treatment Guidelines

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Post Operative rehabilitation is crucial in assisting patients regarding their strength and health and enabling them to return to everyday life. It plays a vital role in pain management, avoid complications and morbidities of Post surgery. Even Post Operative Care of Cataract ensures that the Cataract patient has the best possible results in vision restoration. However, it is essential for eye care professionals to make the patient aware that the end of a successful cataract operation is not the end of her or his treatment for cataract. Good postoperative care is as important as the care taken by the surgeon before and during surgery.

Poor outcomes are distressing or disappointing for patients. They reflect badly on the health or surgical facility and on the surgical team. Poor outcomes may also affect the sustainability of services; they discourage other patients from coming for surgery and make patients even more reluctant to contribute towards the cost of cataract operations.

In general, poor vision after cataract surgery is caused due to inadequate correction of post-operative refractive error, failure to detect pre-existing eye conditions or surgical complications. Poor follow-up after cataract surgery in developing countries makes assessment of operative quality uncertain.

Therefore, focusing on timely access to care for patients after cataract surgery, the next session of Online STG Lecture series - "Post Operative Care of Cataract" has been scheduled on 20th May 2023. Dr Jolly Rohatgi, Director Professor & Head, Department of Ophthalmology, Guru Teg Bahadur Hospital, New Delhi will be the speaker of this session.
