D6.1 Facility ensure its process are in compliance with Statutory and Legal requirement

- Authorization of Bio-medical waste management
- No Smoking sign displayed
- Intimation process of notifiable disease
- Availability of copies of relevant laws and govt order (BMW rules, fire safety, electrical installations and any other as per state mandate)

Authorization for Bio-medical waste management


- Application to State Pollution control board for authorization of generation of BMW.
- Training of Staffs on BMW management
- Recording of quantity of waste generated on daily basis for annual report submission
- Link with nearest CBWTF if any
- Authorization from SPC for deep burial pit



No Smoking sign displayed

Display signages at Strategic site:

- Inside the building Waiting areas, toilets, corridor etc
- Outside the building within the premises- entrance, parking areas etc





Notifiable Disease

- A disease that must legally be reported to government authorities
- It allows authorities to monitor diseases and provides early outbreak warnings.
- In India, the state government is responsible for determining which diseases must be reported to the medical officer in their area and to notify the diseases
- Ex: Cholera, tuberculosis, AIDS, dengue, hepatitis, leprosy, meningitis, plague, and measles

Availability of copies of relevant laws and Govt order

- BMW Rules 2016 (Amendment)
- Fire safety compliance order
 - ✓ Availability of Fire extinguisher
 - ✓ Exit plan
 - ✓ Demarcated assembly point
 - ✓ Training records for fire safety
- Electrical installation Connection paper, load, earthing, danger sign, safety norms etc.
- Guideline of COTPA act
- List of notifiable disease by State
- Copy of Licences and office order

Key Messages

Facility ensure its process are in compliance with Statutory and Legal requirement under D6 standards of NQAS
